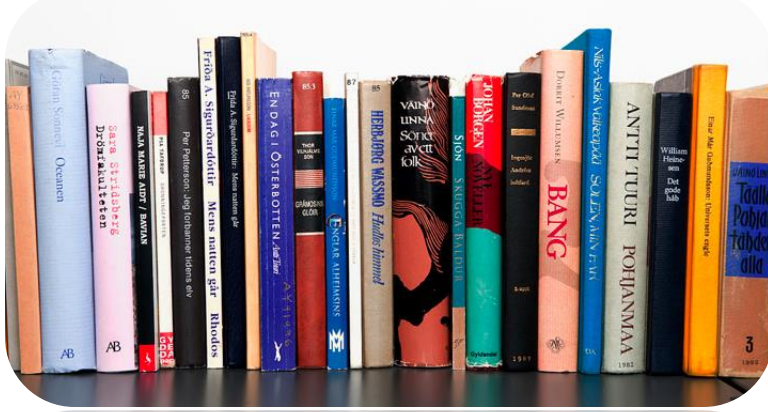


CP 10 ENGLISH
