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Race Survey

As a result of the year 2000 Federal Census, revised standards for the collection of race and ethnicity data have been changed. The United States is providing parents/guardians the opportunity to select one or more races when reporting information on race for Federal data collection.

Race and Hispanic origin are now considered as two separate and distinct concepts. Therefore, Hispanic origin data will be collected separately from race. Hispanic origin is now considered ethnicity. All parents/guardians should take this opportunity to designate the appropriate ethnicity and race for their children. You must answer both questions and sign below.

Question 1. Are you Hispanic or Latino? Select only one

No, not Hispanic or Latino

Yes, Hispanic or Latino: a person of Cuban, Mexican, Chicano, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish Culture or origin, regardless of race.

Question 2. What is your race? You may select one or more races.

White: a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.

Black or African American: a person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

American Indian or Alaska Native: a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America, and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Asian: a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or The Indian subcontinent includes, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander: a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaiian, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
